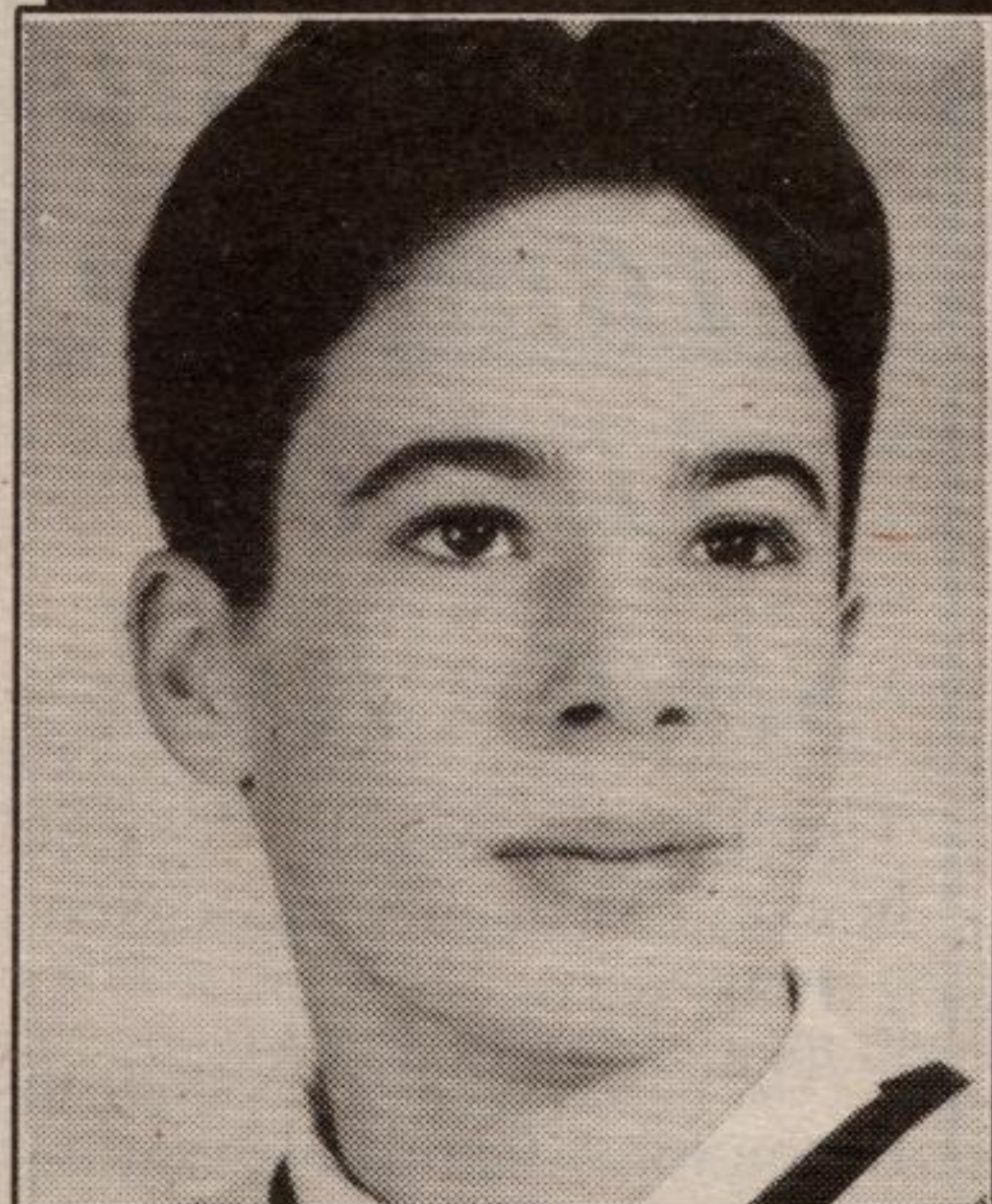


ACTON MINOR HOCKEY REPORT
