Breen brings energy to committee

With most community groups, Doug Breen has sooner or later stepped in the chair or president's role. In high school he worked his way up on student council and was captain of the football team.

So it's not surprising to see Breen succeed Gary Martin as chair of the Eramosa Parks Recreation and Culture Committee.

"I guess I might be a control freak. But the group gave me an endorsement when they made me chair," said Breen, who was essentially acclaimed at the Jan. 18 meeting when two others declined their nomination.

The 29-year-old Rockwood resident even applied for a councillor's position last February.

"I always had aspirations of getting involved in the community," said Breen, who moved here from Guelph a little over three years ago. "My family traditionally has been involved in munici-

pal politics. My younger brother is involved with the Ontario Federation of Agriculture and my grandfather was a school board trustee."



took a critical look at everything in the Township. Gary's done a fantastic job guiding us through the last year," praised Breen, an assistant superintendent of the golf course at the Guelph Country Club.

With the seven-member committee having recently received \$44,500 in principal from the Town to complete natural gas conversions at Rockmosa Community Hall, Breen lists playing surfaces at Rockmosa and Lloyd Dyer Park, with talk of an alarm system at Lloyd Dyer's concession booth and a volunteer drive as the group's immediate priorities.

"We want to stay the course right now," reveals the University of Guelph agriculture, crop science and international development graduate. "We want to look at all avenues of cost saving with each project, and we are going to be asking for volunteers if we paint park bleachers and fill holes on the Rockmosa soccer patch."

A native of Putnam (near London), Breen is encouraged by the group's energy. "Everyone in this group is legitimately concerned. People care about the community. Any decision made isn't with any bias, but what's best for the community."






