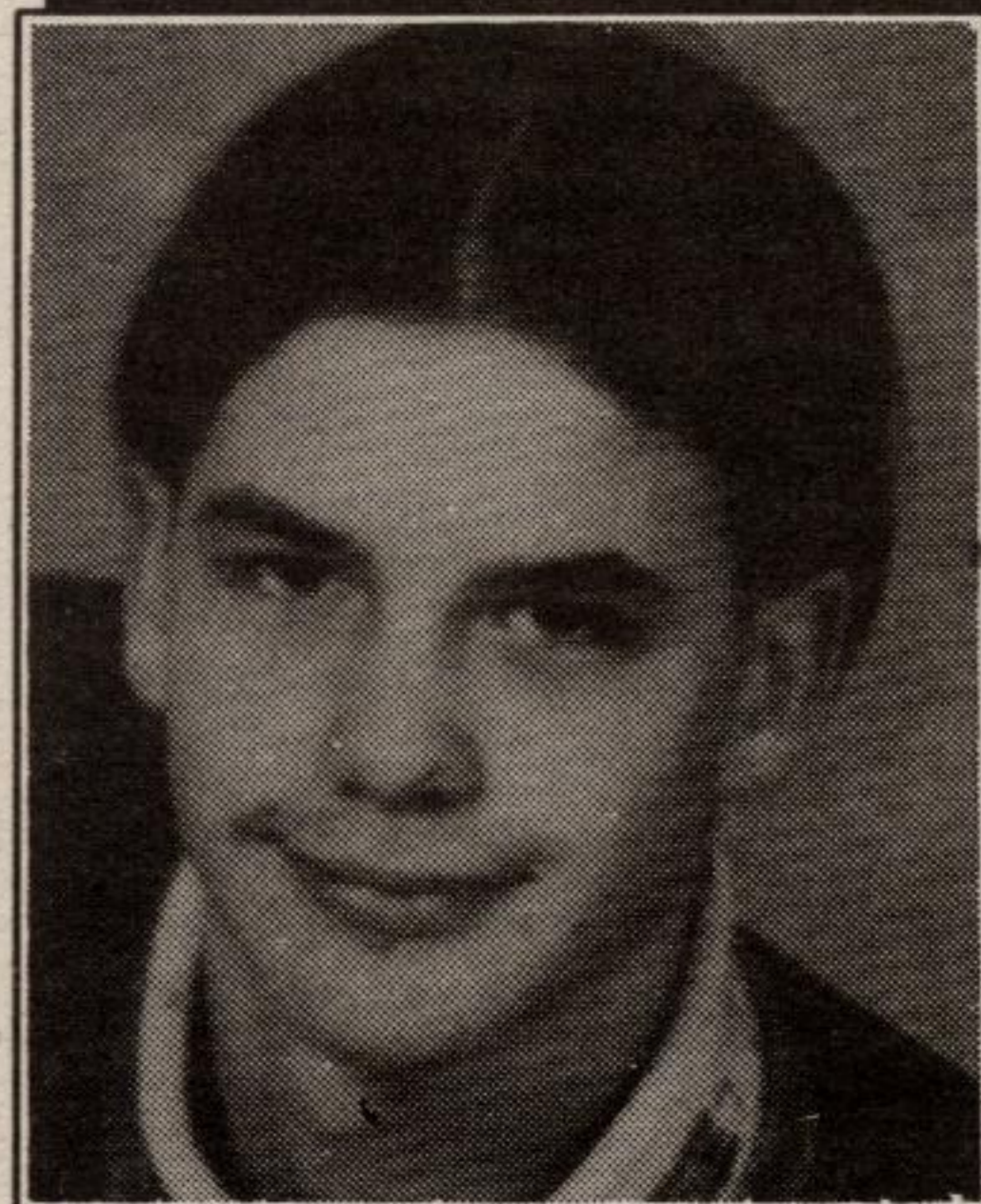


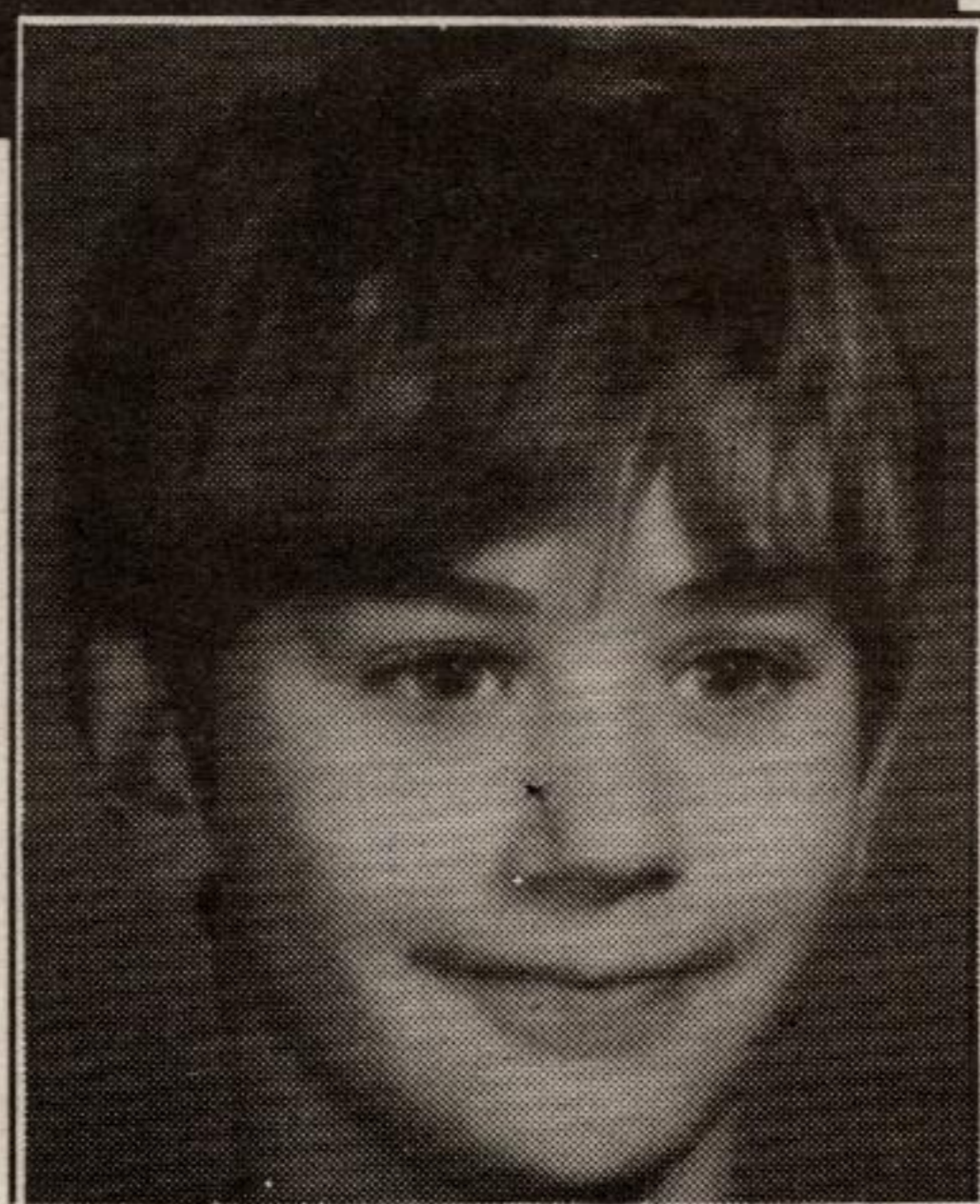
ACTON MINOR HOCKEY REPORT
