Things to know when travelling

Have you left money behind in Europe during your travels there - money you are entitled to bring home? Well, many do who don't follow up to claim their VAT (Value Added Tax) on the purchases they make there. An estimated \$10 million is unclaimed each year! The clerk has to fill in a form when you make a purchase in over 100,000 stores in some 20 countries where "tax-free for tourists" signs are dislayed. You then must present the form at a special counter at the airport before leaving, for your cash refund.

The use of credit cards for purchases in these tax-free stores makes it easier to make your claim as you can do it from home. Just make sure you have the customs officer stamp your claims form as you leave the country and then mail it to the address enclosed. We used this method following a recent visit to Austria - a way to test the system, as the lineup at the airport was too long, and there was a flight to catch! For details, call (416) 467-0947 for the Europe tax-free shopping in Toronto.

Not paying for travel health coverage you already have is a very good idea, but it is better to be safe than sorry. Some credit cards, employer insurance programs and some associations offer coverage and you should investigate all areas - emergency hospital and medical costs, trip cancellation and accidental death are, of course, front and centre. Lost luggage is another. Pre-existing conditions are a major factor. Don't leave home without it if you are leaving the province – even for a day!

The Travel Compensation Fund has been a saviour to many since it was established in 1975. This is for the purpose of protecting the public from unscrupulous people who take your money and don't provide the service and for those bonafide bankruptcies which do occur. But you can't apply for a refund if it is not an Ontario-based company - so over-the-phone buying with any company you are unsure of can be risky.

Travel tip of the week: Ask your travel agent for an extra copy of your travel itinerary with contact information, to leave at home for the baby/house sitter, at the office, or for family or friends.
