### Man escapes death in explosion

Acton's Frank Geng is lucky to be alive.

"Another 15 to 30 seconds of propane leaking in that house and we would have found debris 500 feet away and the homeowner definitely would have been dead," explained Ontario Fire Marshall investigator Robbie Schnurr in an interview on Friday.

Geng's McDonald Boulevard home was rocked by an explosion 10 days ago and Schnurr said his investigation found that propane leaking from a 20-pound cylinder was ignited by the hot water heater's pilot light.

Geng heard hissing coming from the propane cylinder in his garage and he carried it into his basement so he could examine it, leaving a vapour trail that was ignited by the pilot light.

"Carrying that cylinder tank into the house and down to the basement took about a minute. Just a little longer and the explosion would have lifted the house off the ground and there would be almost nothing left," Schnurr explained.

"There's something that I'd like to stress," Schnurr added. "If anyone is ever going to examine a propane cylinder, never do it inside. Always make sure that the vapours can dissipate, either outside or in a well-ventilated area."

Schnurr said the cylinder and its valve is still being examined to determine why the leak occurred. He added it's possibile the house was so structurally damaged that it will have to be torn down and rebuilt.






