Craig Kirkwood came up big with a hat-trick for Al & Al's. Greg Henry contributed a pair of goals and Shawn Harkley had a single.

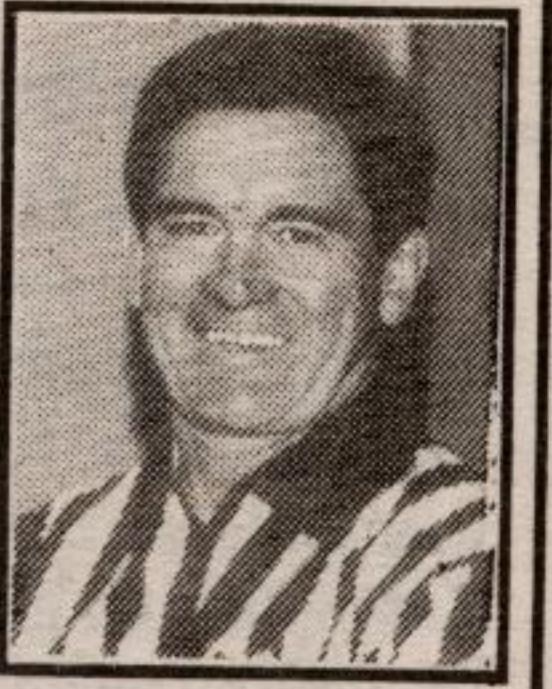
Brad Ethier, Henry and Jason Rauwerda had assists.
