


Dave McIntyre says there are still a handful of Sabres' teams vying for a Tri-County championship, with another four battling in the OMHA quarterfinals.

None of the local Tri-County participants are playing below .500, while the Rotary Club Atom 1 and Acton Precision Millwrights Midget Sabres are up in their best-of-five OMHA series. The Andy's Restaurant Novice 2 team is tied 1-1 and the Acton Proplastex Atom 2 club is down 2-1.

"Acton teams have done very well this season for a town its size. I'm more than happy," says McIntyre, Acton Minor Hockey Association (AMHA) president. "Acton has always been noted as a hockey town.

"It's our (Acton's) main focus of sports. I think that drives everybody to play to the top of their ability."

McIntyre, who has been involved with the AMHA for 10 years, says Acton's high standing in all divisions this season says as much about the young talent here as it does about the people behind the bench.




