A 12"x15" banner is to be made, depicting the name of our branch, ready for the District Annual on May 23 at Louville United Church.


Today's thought was read by Anne entitled A Beautiful Red Cardinal.




Safe cycling a must!

Remember, bicycle helmets are mandatory now for persons up to 18 years of age, and further, Section 104 (2.2) of the Highway Traffic Act states the parent or guardian of a person uder 16 years who permits the child to ride a bicycle without a helmet is subject to a charge under this section.

Bicycles are not allowed on the sidewalk when being ridden. Bicycles must be travelling on the right side of the road the same as a motor vehicle, and must stop for stop signs and red lights and are subject to the same fines as the driver of a motor vehicle.
