

ACTON MINOR HOCKEY REPORT

After their elimination from OMHA playoffs, the Acton Precision Millwrights Midget Sabres opened their best-of-five Tri-County final series at home to Chinguacousy on Monday night.

The Sabres came away with a convincing 8-4 win over the visitors, on the strength of five goals from the three McIntyre brothers.

Phil McIntyre was the sharp shooter for the local side, firing a hat-trick. Matt Boycott also had a big night, scoring the first two Acton markers. Derrick McIntyre, team captain Chris Williams and Brian McIntyre also hit the scoresheet for the home side.

Derrick McIntyre contributed three assists to the Sabre cause, while two-assist nights were recorded by Adam DaPonte, Phil McIntyre, Brian

McIntyre and Jason Pembleton. Gary Genzler and Bantam call-up Bob Brooks passed for single helpers.

The Sabres managed to double their opponents on the scoreboard despite having a depleted roster. Only two lines were used by the home side in this series opener.

Team Manager Dave McIntyre commented after the encounter that "this was a rare penalty-free game, for both sides.

"We had a good passing game tonight, and everything seemed to click for us."

McIntyre said Bantam call-up Mark Faseruk had a strong game on the blue line for the Sabres.


