Rockwood company ELI Eco Logic Inc was recently awarded a contract from the U.S. Department of Energy for the treatment of hazardous wastes, radioactive mixed low level wastes and explosives such as TNT.

The contract is also coordinated with several elements of the U.S. Department of Defence. It's a multi-phased, multi-year approach to addressing the two departments' stored waste inventories.

The contract complements work Eco Logic is doing with the U.S. Army in the area of chemical warfare destruction, said Dr. Douglas Hallett, president and CEO of Eco Logic.


