The Acton Precision Millwrights Midget Sabres hockey squad went undefeated in their year-end tournament in Pickering last weekend, capping off a successful 1995-96 campaign with some impressive hardware.

Goalie Mike Kempton, who has been a pillar of strength for the Sabres throughout the playoffs, was awarded the tournament MVP trophy for his efforts.

"The Midgets played a disciplined style of hockey," said Acton Minor Hockey Association President Dave McIntyre on Monday. "They really played an excellent tournament."

"This was a well-run tournament in Pickering, and I recommend it to all our AMHA teams in the future. There were very nice trophies awarded as well."

In Game 1 Acton hammered Wallaceburg by a 9-1 score, with Bantam call-up Bob Brooks firing four goals to lead the locals.

Phil and Brian McIntyre each hit for a pair of goals in the win, while Derrick McIntyre opened the scoring for the Sabres.

Brian and Scott McIntyre each passed for three assists, with Derrick McIntyre and Gavin Hall picking up a pair each. Single helpers went to Trevor Malloy, Ryan Preuter and Steve White.

Goalie Kempton took MVP honours in the game.

Acton took Game 2 by default as the Brampton Sharks failed to ice enough skaters to play a regulation game.

In their closest match of

the tournament, the Sabres shaded Whitby 3-2 in their third tournament game.

Adam DaPonte, Chris Williams and Preuter scored the Acton goals in this tight contest, with assists going to Jason Pembleton (2), Williams, Derrick McIntyre and DaPonte.

Kempton was solid between the pipes to again take MVP honours.

The Sabres defeated Vaughn 6-2 in Game 4 as game MVP Malloy pocketed a pair of markers.

Single goals came from the sticks of Preuter, DaPonte, Derrick McIntyre and Brian

McIntyre.
