



AHS hoop stars flyin' high

Acton High School Boys basketball squads have had it rough in recent years, but Redmen Jamie Goy and Chris Young recently demonstrated that the AHS program may be on the rise. Literally.

High-flyers Goy and Young won the Senior and Junior slam-dunk competitions which were run in conjuction with the Halton Classic all-star games at T.A. Blakelock high school in Oakville on March 29.

Young was also selected by Oakville's cable TV station as Most Valuable Player in the Junior all-star game.

Goy, a centre with the Senior Redmen this past season, and Young, a Junior guard, were selected to represent Acton in the two Classic games, which saw the top players in the Volpe Division square off against their counterparts from the Richardson Division.

The Volpe team was made up of players from mostly Oakville and north-Halton schools (Acton, Milton and Georgetown), while the Richardson side featured players from Burlington.

Young, who had seven points for the winning Volpe Juniors, said on Monday that "it was an excellent experience to represent Acton in the all-star game, and it felt great to win the MVP and slam-dunk competition. It looks like all my hard training may be paying off."

Young, a 17-year-old Grade 11 student, was contacted by a talent scout after his slam-dunk exhibition.

The scout, James Thomas of the All-Ontario Scouting Service, asked Young to consider attending a Junior National Team tryout in June.

"He asked me about my game at school and he wanted to know about the grades I've been getting," said Young.

The Junior guard also competed in the three-point shooting competition, finishing in a tie for second place.

Young, who stands 5 feet 10½ inches tall and weighs in at 165 pounds, presently plays club basketball with the Milton Monarchs. He says his goal is to play basketball in university or college.

Goy picked up 10 points for the Volpe Senior all-stars in their victory over the Richardson side.

"The game was fun," said the 20-year-old O.A.C. student yesterday (Tuesday). "It was fast-paced basketball and I had a great time."

Goy, who presently is helping teach phys-ed at McKenzie-Smith as part of his school co-op program, stands 6 feet 5 inches and is 185 pounds.

Last summer he won the slam-dunk competition at Olympia basketball camp and finished second in a Triple Crown dunk-off in Guelph.

He plans to enter area three-on-three hoop tournaments this summer.

"It felt really good to win the all-star dunking competition, knowing that I was representing Acton," said Goy.

"I was pretty impressed that Acton cleaned up. When it was over, I walked over to congratulate Chris on winning, then I waved to the crowd and said 'This one's for Acton High!"
