Soccer numbers up over last year

First-year President Rick Boychuk said Monday that Acton Minor Soccer Club registrations now total 410.

That number is a significant increase over last year, when 352 players signed on.

And this year's total actually swells to 432 when adult registrants are factored in.

"We're really pleased," said Boychuk. "It's been a very healthy registration. I expect we'll actually end up with around 460 players."

Boychuk reports that the increases have come across the board, with new teams added in most age divisions.

There are eight teams competing in the Under-7 division compared to six last year. Under-9 Girls will likely field three teams (an increase of two), while Under-9 Boys will go from three to four.

Under-13 Boys increase from one to three teams (two recreational and one competitive). Under-13 Girls have added one squad and now have three.

Under-11 Girls have two teams again, while Under-11 Boys stays the same at three.

Under-15 Girls will dress one recreational team, with the Under-15 Boys putting together one competitive and one house league side.

There will be one team in both Boys and Girls Under-17 divisions.

With all the new players, Boychuk says the club could use more referees and more soccer fields in '96.

"We have to get a message to the Town that we're a growing club and that we really don't have a suitable dedicated soccer field in Acton," said Boychuk.


Boychuk said exhibition games will begin on May 11. League action will commence the week of May 20.
