






## Gardening projects on for spring!

Last Saturday, eight members from Acton's Horticultural Society joined with members of twenty-one other societies to attend the annual meeting of District 6, Ontario Horticultural Association, held in Paris, Ontario.

The provincial Horticultural Association was organized in 1906 but many societies had been formed before that year. The Paris group began in 1867, Hamilton in 1850 and the Simcoe Society is celebrating it's hundredth anniversary, Acton is one of the newer organizations, having formed in 1988.

The Society's convention in Hamilton, from June 14 to 16, will represent 45,000 members from across Ontario. The keynote speaker will be David Tarrant, "The Canadian Gardener" of TV fame from Vancouver.

In Paris, the Acton members attended workshops including "Woodland Treasures," "Landscaping Do's and Don'ts," "Carolinian Flora and Fauna" and "The World of Insects."

Locally, the society is busy planning a garden contest, which should interest the residents of Acton and area. They hope to provide a variety of classes to include all gardeners - from apartment dwellers to rural residents. Details will be available soon.

Another local project is the planning and planting of the flower containers and beds in Acton. This is done in cooperation with the B.I.A. and adds greatly to the beautification of the town during the summer months.

The annual fundraiser sale of plants, is May 11, in the olde Hide House parking lot.
