## Eramosa baseball beef settled quietly

The minor baseball season in Eramosa opened without any hitches on Sunday—and with no sign of the hurt feelings and bad blood between two leagues, both of which wanted to play at Lloyd Dyer Park.

Although both the president and one of two vice-presidents of the Rockwood Minor Ball Association (REMBA) resigned over the issue, remaining REMBA vice-president Paul Hewitt told *The Miller* on Monday night that he would not resign and that REMBA would hold elections in the fall to replace Colin Langridge and Mike Plunkett.

Both resigned after the Construction and 3-Pitch Leagues asked Eramosa Council to referee when REMBA assigned Lloyd

Dyer to the 3-Pitch and not the Construction League.

Although Council asked Reeve Rick Hughes to mediate the dispute, representatives of each league hammered out a deal on their own allowing one league to use the Lloyd Dyer diamonds one year, and the other league the following year.

Plunkett said his resigning was a matter of principle.

"The whole issue was handled in a manner that I didn't agree with," he said. "When the Township gives a job to a volunteer group, the group should have enough autonomy to do the job without interference."

Construction League president Sam Diamond said they made a deal with the 3-Pitch League to "keep peace in the community and for the benefit of the kids in the leagues."

Wednesday saw many hugs and handshakes around the office as it was Secretary's Day. A big thank you goes to Mrs. Rennie, Mrs.

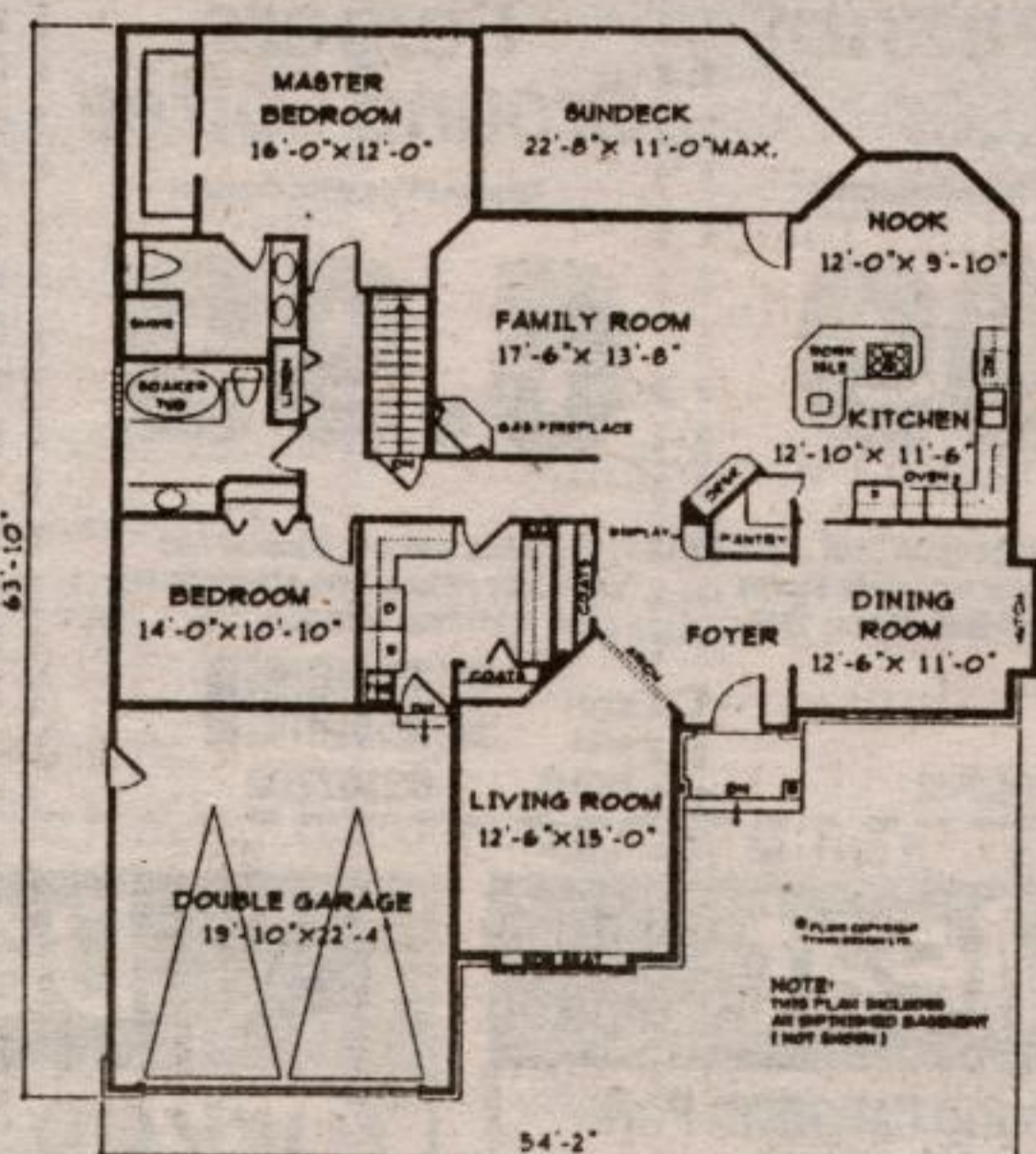
Anderson and Mrs. Way for all their hard work for the students of our school.
