

Holmes, Pembleton win 'Cane awards

Local hockey players Tyler Holmes and Andrew Pembleton both won year-end awards for their play with the Triple-A Halton Hurricanes in the 1995-96 season.

The Hurricane hardware was handed out at a banquet last Monday night at Bishop Reding school in Milton.

Pembleton, Kingham Road resident, won the Most Sportsmanlike Player Award for his Major Atom club.

The 11-year-old firstyear player skated with the AMHA Sabres before this season. He's a Grade 6 student at McKenzie-Smith Bennett and he pa-

trols the right wing for the Hurricanes.

Pembleton's team finished second in the regular season, but went on to win the Southern Central Triple-A playoffs.

Holmes, another Most Sportsmanlike winner, toiled for the Minor Novice Hurricanes, playing left wing and centre.

The 8-year-old is a Grade 3 student at Rockwood Centennial and he played Tyke in the Acton House League loop.

After a sub-par regular season, Holmes's team came up with a Cinderella playoff performance, winning the SCTA championship.

Taillefer award winner has 'love for the game'

"I was surprised to get the award," said McIntyre yesterday. "It's a real honour and I'd like to thank all the older players who were there for me when I was younger.


"Now that we're Midgets we have the chance to give something back to the young players and the community, and I enjoy that."
