Two Rockwood women nominated for 'Y' awards

Two Rockwood women are among 13 Wellington County women nominated for Women of Distinction Awards to be presented by the YMCA-YWCA of Guelph later this month.

The awards recognize the nominees' unique contributions to the advancement of

women and although the 'Y' has issued the awards nationally, this is the first time the Guelph 'Y' has taken part in the program.

The Rockwood women nominated are Margo Davis and Janet Daly.

Davis, nominated in the Community Life category, is an accredited La Leche League leader, who said she was both "excited and surprised" to have been nominated.

"It's quite an honour, but you're not taught how to accept honours gracefully, so I'm very proud, but also very humbled," Davis said after hearing the news.

"I've always considered the work I do with moms and their babies to be my reward." Davis's nominator praised her for being available "24 hours a day, 365 days a year" to help breast-feeding moms and their babies and noted Davis had gone out in snowstorms and on Christmas Day when someone needed her.

Business and Economics nominee Janet Daly was recognized for her 30 years of voluntary work with the Guelph Humane Society, where she keeps the books, organizes annual tag days and does "just about everything else," according to her nominator, her daughter Margaret Daly-Nolan.

"If I could be half the woman my mother is, my life would be fulfilled," Daly-Nolan wrote on her mom's nomination form.

Daly-Nolan said her mother didn't want to be nominated at first.

"She said there were people more deserving of the award than herself, but I think that deep down she was excited."

All of the nominated women and winners will be honored at a ceremony in Guelph tomorrow (May 30).

Spirit Valley show celebrates the arts

If you've ever had the urge to be a callithumpian – to be a boisterous music-maker in a mock serenade – organizers of *The Spirit Valley Experience* want you.

The nature-inspired arts experience in the Rockwood Conservation Area on Saturday, Sept. 7, will explore the performing and visual arts, music, song, dance and food—all along a beautiful section of the Eramosa River—an area some call Spirit Valley.

Audience members will wind their way along the river, past limestone caves and bluffs to the 150-year-old Harris woolen mill ruins, where a main stage and bleachers will be set up.

The Spirit Valley Experience is an Arts and Culture in Eramosa (ACE) production involving some who staged the Spirit of Shivaree and The Eramosa Theatrical Hike.

ACE member Dale Hamilton said interested people can get details of the production at a public meeting tomorrow (May 30) at the Rockwood Town Hall.

"We will have a slide show of the different sites and do a visual walk-through of some of the planned events and give people a taste of the local entertainment we will present," Hamilton explained.

Everyone is encouraged to get involved and there are

many volunteer positions – from production crews, security, food, fundraising and street performers.

"Mime artist Stephen La Frenie will offer free workshops during the summer for people who would like to learn and there will also be workshops for performance skills, and mask and costume making," Hamilton said.

Hamilton hopes the event will become an annual event and also an economic development tool for Eramosa.

"This will bring people to Rockwood and dovetail nicely with the Eden Mills Writers Festival, which is the following day.

"We have confirmed artists from Russia and Brazil and will be doing a lot of advertising asking people to come to Rockwood," he said.

Although the Grand River Conservation Authority rejected ACE plans for a temporary entrance into the Conservation Area along Valley Road, it did approve the building of two permanent, wooden platform stages in and around the mill ruins.
