Coach Bill Clark said the team had a top defensive game.

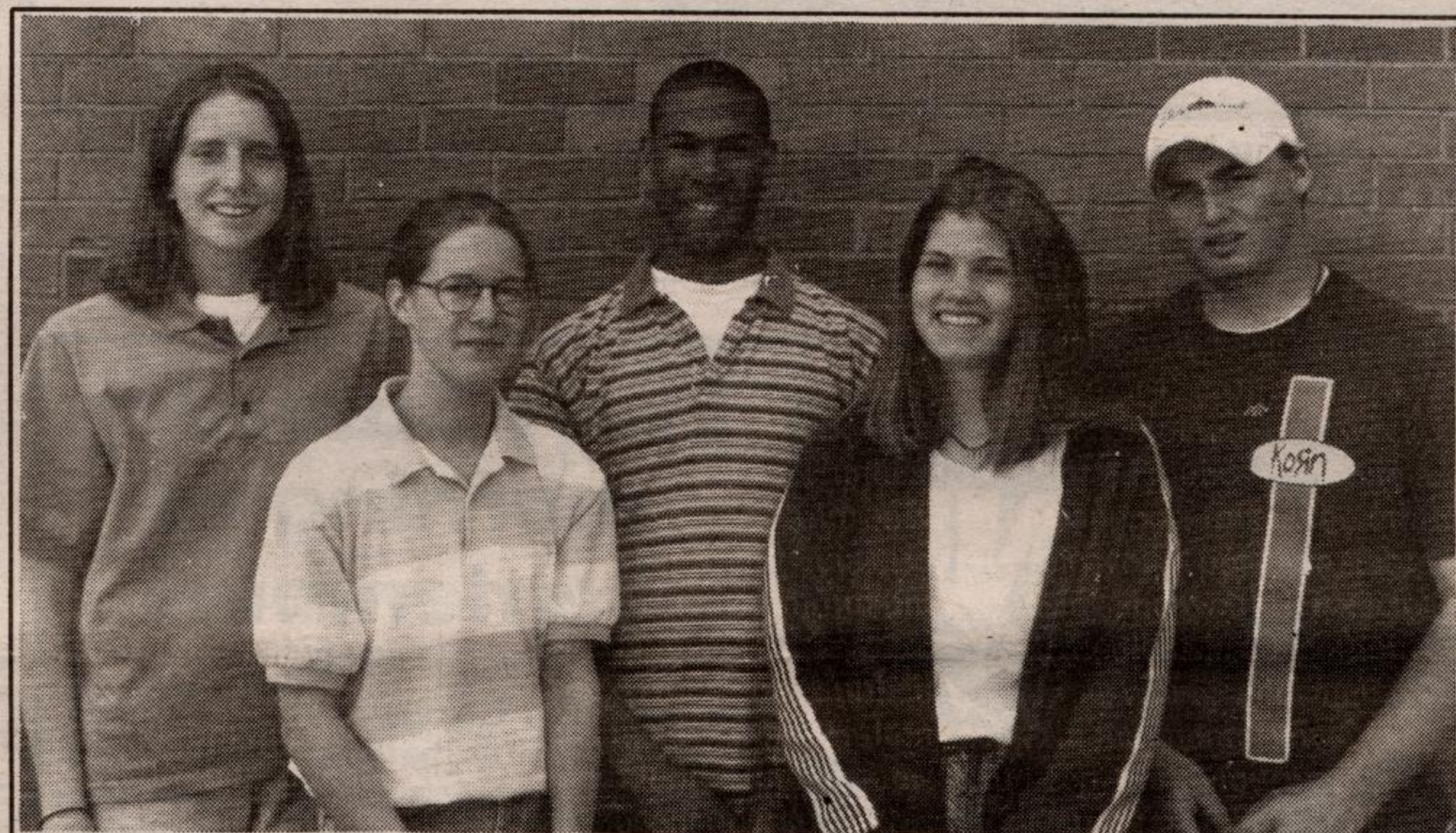
#### MOSQUITO BOYS
