Andrews, Austin are top finishers at Regional meet

Midgets Rachel Andrews and Rebecca Austin were the top Acton High finishers at the Regional Track and Field Meet at McMaster University in Hamilton Thursday.

With a pair of sixth-place finishes, both athletes just missed qualifying for OFSAA (the top four in each event go on to the all-Ontario meet).

Andrews picked up her sixth place in the Midget Girls triple jump, leaping 9.67 metres. She also competed in the 100-metres, where she ran 11th in a time of 13.5.

Austin finished sixth in the Midget Girls discus, tossing 23.01 metres. In the shot put event, Austin was 12th with a throw of 7.78 metres.

Midget Sandy Chapman ran seventh in the Boys 3,000-metre race, in 10.28.

Junior Boy shot-putter Joel Lucier was eighth-best with a toss of 13.12 metres.

Kristin Finley was ninth in the Midget Girls 80-metre hurdles in a time of 14.16.

Rob Turpin finished 13th in the Junior Boys triple jump, leaping 11.34 metres.
