More channels coming to cable

The sale of Halton Cablesystems Inc. to Western Co-Axial Limited will mean Acton and Rockwood subscribers will have 25 more cable channels to watch.

One immediate benefit from the sale, recently approved by the Canadian Radio and Telecommunications Commission, is the addition of CBC's Newsworld to the existing 40 channels local cable subscribers can access.

Western Co-Axial vice president of marketing and programming, Bill Custers, said although they are still seeing how the Acton operation runs, they are committed to making major improvements in the near future.

"Our long-term game plan includes a complete rebuilding of the system hardware and an increase in channel capacity to 65 from 40 channels," Custers said on Friday.

"Now we begin the process of getting in there and running the shop on a day-today basis so we can see what's going to happen in the long run.

"Over the next six to eight months we will rebuild the cable system in Halton so we can add services like payper-view, the Movie Network and some more super stations because we have a policy that will try to carry every licensed available service and bring it to our customers," Custers said, noting that the next year will be "phenomenal" in terms of growth.

Custers said there will not be any immediate changes to the existing 20 staff in Acton, but they will supplement the staff with some of their own people so they can learn the local operation.

"We haven't had an opportunity to meet with the
staff there in any depth –
we've talked to them one-onone and as a group to let them
know who we are, but we
haven't gotten into the real
operational issues at all yet."

Western Co-Axial is a family-owned company which operates two cable companies in Hamilton, one in Fergus and one in Grimsby.

Custers said former Halton Cablesystems owner David Hastings, a Guelph lawyer, will remain on Western Co-Axial's Board of Directors.



Square watermelons were developed in Japan – probably because they stacked easier in the produce section and took up less space.




