After that they played manhunt in the woods and had a campfire and ate marshmallows. Trevor climbed a tree to get his roasting stick.

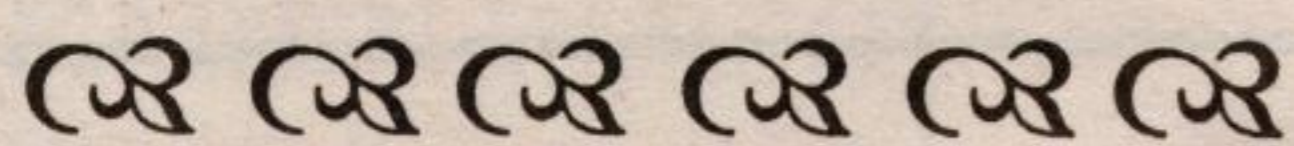
They went to bed at 10 pm.
