## New hope for Bowstring Bridge in Heritage report

Eramosa Township officials are not sure how much weight the Coast Guard will give to a Canadian Heritage, Parks Canada report that urges that the Bowstring Bridge in Eden Mills be saved, not demolished and replaced.

\*When it was determined that the Eramosa River under the bridge was navigable water, the Coast Guard's Environmental Assessment Branch circulated the Township's proposal to replace the aging, heritage structure with a modern, two-lane bridge.

That plan drew opposition from Canadian Heritage Service Coordinator Paul Couture, who said, "I urge that the [Eden Mills] bridge be protected."

In his letter to the Coast Guard, Couture based the his-

· its intrinsic historical value based on its age, design type and rarity;

· bridge removal would have a negative effect on the historical character of Eden Mills:

· the bridge has an important historical value in the view of the community;

· the bridge is a recognized heritage resource of the Grand River watershed.

Couture also warned against a proposal suggested by the Township to make a new bridge look like the old one by giving it what Couture called a "heritage veneer".

going with either of these two options means the destruction of the original bridge and the loss of the historical values...preserving and using the present bridge is the preferred option," he wrote.

Eramosa Reeve Rick Hughes predicted no work would be done on the bridge this year because of Coast Guard restrictions on construction timing to protect the cold water fishery. Hughes said they hope to have an answer from the Coast Guard on the environmental requirements in 30 days.

"There are at least five options, everything from a desk review of the bridge replacement plans to a full federal review of the bridge replacement plans, possible," Hughes explained on Thursday, noting that he would be "very concerned" if a fullblown hearing was necessary.

"At that point in time we'd have to involve our lawyer and engineer for days and weeks at a hearing, and you'd have to look at it and say, 'Could we have gone ahead with the condition survey and avoided all this?""

Friends of Eden Mills spokesman Chris Wilson said their group's offer to pay for half the cost of a condition

survey stands. "We hope that Couture's comments will put a brake on the bridge replacement project, but will just have to await and see what the coast Guard decides will happen."


