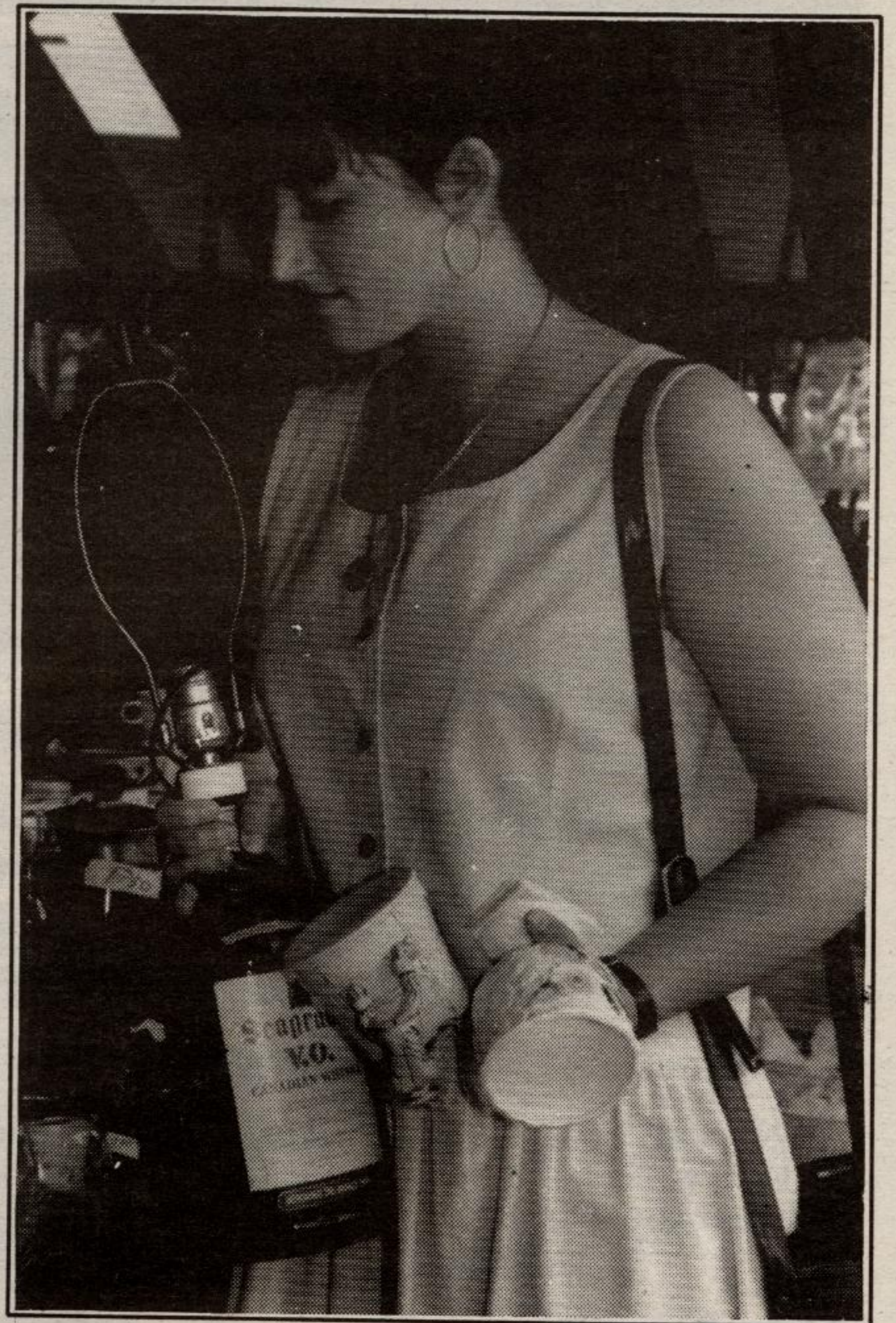
Leaders Marie Martin and Andrew Marsh discussed the upcoming judging competi-

Starter home suits compact lot

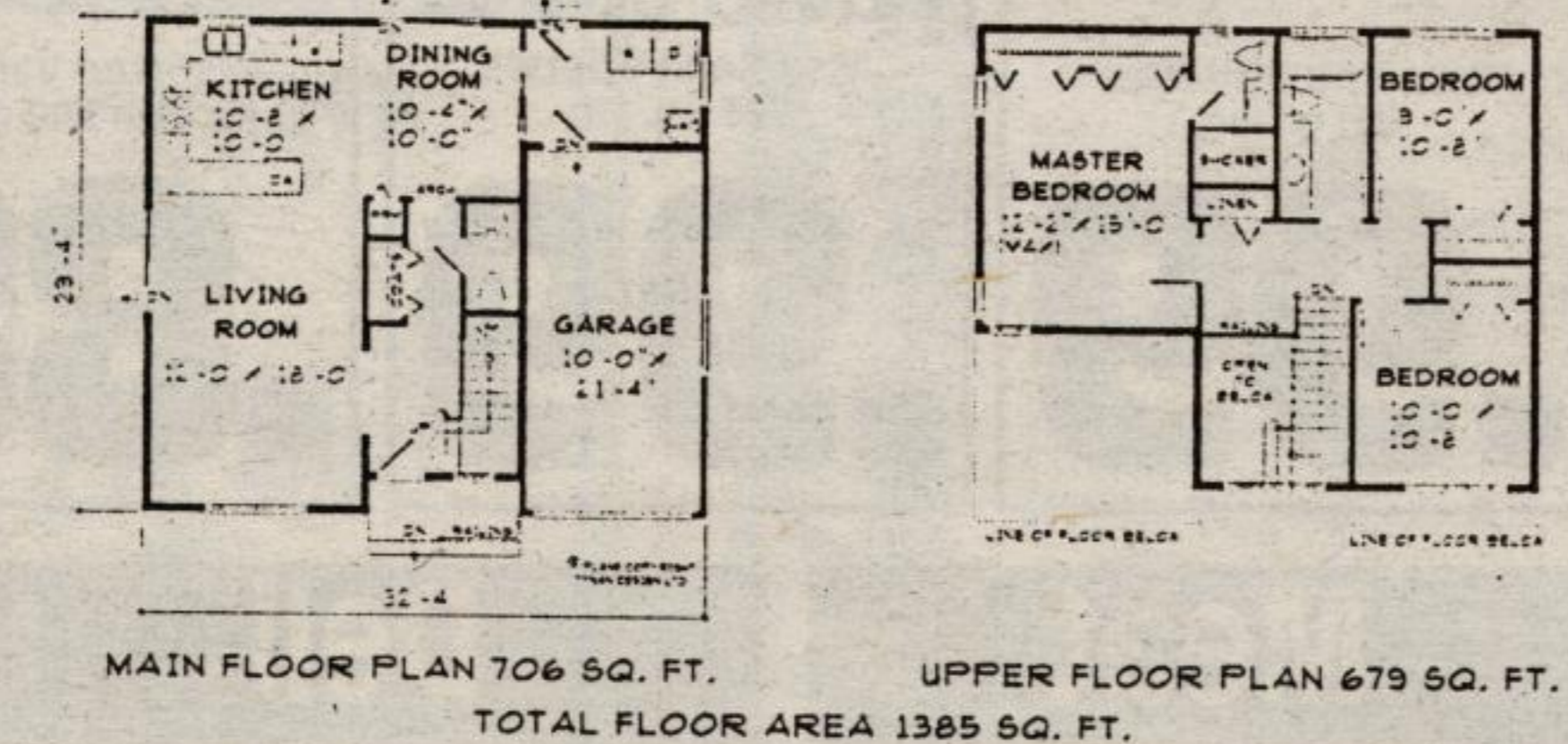


Low square footage combined with a simple foundation and roof plan make this design a smart choice for those just starting out.

## MP supports tough parole

Guelph-Wellington MP Brenda Chamberlain offered support for Bill C-45 yesterday (Tuesday), legislation which makes significant changes to Section 745 of the Canadian Criminal Code. "My constituents have asked me to get tough with criminals, particularly violent repeat offenders. The legislation will mean that a person who commits multiple murders will no longer have the right to apply under Section 745 for early parole," Chamberlain said.

Other changes to Section 745 mean there will no longer be an automatic right to a hearing. A superior court judge will have to be persuaded that the applicant has a reasonable prospect for success. As well, a Section 745 jury will have to reach a unanimous decision. Currently, only a two-thirds majority is required.

"These are important changes. The bill gives a strong message that we do not tolerate violent crime in Canada," added Chamberlain.
