'New experience' for Marshall as head of coaches

AMHA still taking applications

Cliff Fletcher? He's got an easy job compared to Steve Marshall.

While the Toronto Maple Leaf G.M. has his hands full searching for a new bench boss for next season, his counterpart here in Acton is busy filling nine coaching positions with the Acton Minor Hockey Association Sabres.

And while Fletcher is taking his sweet time, Marshall even has a deadline: next Thursday evening. That's when the AMHA executive is expected to announce a slate of coaches for all nine teams for the 1996-97 season, from Novice through to Midget.

Marshall, 40, is the firstever coaching coordinator for the AMHA, and he admits that "it'll be a new experience. The executive has been talking about creating this job for a couple of years, though "

Last season, Marshall coached the Atom 1Sabres, who made it to the OMHA semi-finals before bowing out

to Six Nations. However he's hanging up his whistle this winter, as he'll be busy with administrative duties.

"Basically I'll be overseeing and supporting the coaching staffs. I will be someone for the coaches to bounce ideas off during the season.

"My other goal is to develop a progressive system that will start with Novice 2 and continue through. I'm not going to tell people how to coach, but I'll set up a system for players to follow - especially in practice sessions."

Marshall, who is one of the more successful local coaches in recent years, is well-qualified for the job. He also has a OMHA softball championship title to his coaching credit.

"We already have applicants, but we're willing to look at anyone if they're interested and contact me before next Thursday (June 27).
