

Traffic improvements ongoing for entire summer

The Main and Alma Streets intersection in Rockwood will be "much safer and less confusing" when the Province and Township complete a summer construction project.

The Ministry of Transportation (MTO) project includes

installation of traffic signals and some parking changes on Main Street.

Some parking spaces will be added in front of Saunders Bakery and the same number of spaces will be removed from just south of Saunders.

The Township's project

includes replacing the existing sidewalks in front of Doodles on the north side of Alma Street and on the east side of Main Street from the intersection north to Shanley Street.

On the west side of Main Street a new sidewalk will be

installed from the intersection north to Division Street.

"The traffic signals in Rockwood were needed for safety and to make the intersection less confusing," explained Eramosa Township's Works Superintendent Len Smeltzer last Thursday, not-

ing that all of the work should be complete by mid-August.

There is also ongoing construction west of Rockwood at the Hwy. 7-County Road 29, or Eden Mills Road intersection.

"Over the past nine or 10 years there have been numer-


ous accidents at that corner - some serious and some not - so installation of traffic signals is warranted there," Smeltzer said.

Installation of lights at Eden Mills Road and Hwy. 7 is an MTO-Wellington County project.
