
The horseshoe players competed in Milton and finished fourth. The senior golf team will be playing in Sundridge on July 27.

### MICROWAVE PEACH JAM

No fuss, no heat, no bother with this quickly prepared jam. Makes a great top-1 ping for scones, muffins, bagels or toast.

chopped, peeled i peaches

3 tbsp sugar cornstarch 1 tbsp

1/4 tsp EACH ground | ginger, allspice, cinnamon 1 tbsp freshlemon juice

In one-quart bowl, cook peaches, sugar, cornstarch, ginger, allspice, cinnamon and lemon juice on high, 3 minutes. Stir mixture well and microwave on high | another 3-4 minutes until mixture thickens.

Set aside to cool slightly. Cover and refrigerate several hours or overnight until thickened.

Keeps in fridge for 2-3 weeks or in the freezer for up to 6 months. Makes about 2 cups.
