Shortt trades Acton for Atlanta

Acton police constable Dave Shortt's Olympic dream has come true - Shortt is in Atlanta as a volunteer security guard for the Games.

Shortt, of Ballinafad, is one of 12 Halton officers who volunteered for the Olympic security contingent, for the first time, made up of approximately 26,000 current and former police officers from across North America.

"I always have been interested in the Olympics, but I know the closest I'll ever get is to watch them because I'm not that good of an athlete,"

Shortt joked last Tuesday.

"It's always been a dream of mine to actually see the best in the world at their events. I am pumped - I can't wait.

"I mean, can you imagine seeing Donovan Bailie and Bruny Surin getting

the gold and silver medals in the men's 100-metre while O'Canada played?"

Shortt, who paid his own airfare and is using vacation time for the trip, received his assignment when he landed at the Atlanta airport yesterday (Tuesday).

"I've been told to expect to work six, eight-hour shifts with one day off until the games end.

"I'll get three meals a day, a uniform and security work, which could include everything from crowd control

to guarding equipment and sites overnight," Shortt said.

Shortt said that a group from the Austrian Olympics in 2000 will be in Atlanta to assess how well the police security contingent worked.

Hertz Rent-a-Car supplied a vehicle and Ramada Inns provided free rooms on the way to Georgia. Champion Sports, an Olympic sponsor, gave the Halton officers equipment to use while away.

Events include a dunk tank, live entertainment, mini tractor pull, potato sack races and more!




