T-BALL


In T-Ball action, Daniel Varanelli battled A&S Engraving to a 24-24 tie on July 16 at Donald Mann.

Six days later the Daniel Varanelli crew met up with the Kentucky Fried Chicken Mighty Chickens at Donald Mann.


