

Eramosa Council not to buy Group of Seven prints

Eramosa Council will not make an offer to purchase either of two prints from Group of Seven artist A.J. Casson that were offered to the Township by their owner, a Woodbridge art collector.

sought independent appraisals of the two prints, it determined that because of the current financial climate it was not in a position to purchase either of them.

Print owner Cameron Onderisin said he was selling off part of his collection and thought he should give first right of refusal to the Township since the prints, Rockwood, 1926 and Saturday Afternoon depict the village.

Eramosa administrative assistant Kerri O'Kane said that while Council was not able to purchase the prints, it passed the information along to the Rockwood Creative Arts Association, which had expressed some interest in the artwork. Association chair Ross Durphy said the issue would be discussed among the members.
