## Rams pound Arthur, take championships

It was not easy for the Acton Knights of Columbus Tyke Rams, But then nothing worthwhile ever is.

Late comebacks, overtime drama and slow starts couldn't stop the Rams who captured the Zone 8 'B' Division championship with a 15-5 pounding of Arthur, August 19 in Acton.

The win gave Acton the title by virtue of a 3-1 record in their four-game round home-and-home robin playoff series with zone 8 rivals Kitchener-Waterloo Braves and Arthur Aces, who finished with 2-2 and 1-3 records respectively.

In the deciding game before the hometown fans, the Rams completely dominated Arthur jumping out to a 5-0 lead after the first period. They stretched it to 6-0 early in the second frame before the visitors responded. But Acton continued to pour it on, extending their lead to 11-3 after two periods and making the final a decisive 10-goal margin of victory.

Leading the way for the champions were Justin

Gibson, Garrett Williams and scored four goals. Kevin Deforest added two more while Greg Henry chipped in with a single marker.

Artem collected four assists while Mitch Thompson and Henry had three helpers. Winning goaltender Michael Krasnay, Williams, T.J. Ferriera, Wade Kuiken-Rodgers, Deforest and Nathan Brown had two assists apiece with Ryan O'Connell and Brett Maltby adding single helpers.

The road to the championship was not easy for the Rams who finished the 1996 regular season with a 6-4-2 record, good for third-place in the league. They opened the playoffs with a tough 7-5 loss to Kitchener-Waterloo, August 6 in K-W.

Falling behind 3-0 early in the second period the Rams rallied with goals from Williams, Artem, and Deforest to close the gap to only 4-3 after 40 minutes. Two more goals in the third from Kuiken-Rodgers and Artem, his second of the game, gave


the Rams their first lead. But Braden Artem who each the Braves proved a tough bunch scoring three times in a one-and-a-half minute span late in the third to take the

One night later in Acton, the Rams juggernaut reached full speed as they jumped out to a 6-2 first period lead over K-W and then cruised to a relatively easy 10-6 win.

Artem logged the hat-trick, while Deforest and Gibson had two apiece with Thompson, Krasnay and Henry adding singles.

Shelley Woolner of Acton and Christine Carter of Georgetown shot a 180 and 181 to finish well back.


## No-Stars end perfect season
