ET owner Paul Jordan refused to comment about the closure except to say that there may be a final liquidation sale this weekend and that his family would remain in Acton.

The Four Seasons' licence was revoked for 28 days following a June hearing, which ordered the sanction against the restaurant after an inspector found adulterated liquor and liquor not in the original government container, contrary to the Liquor Licence Act.




