Acton upsets Rockwood, take series with 10-0 win

PITCHING AND DEFENCE KEY TO 2-1 SERIES WIN

Pitching and defence continued to pay dividends for the Acton Remark Telecom Mosquito Rep boys baseball club as they captured the Halton Rural Mosquito Baseball Championship with a 10-0 shutout over Rockwood, Aug. 27 at Prospect Park in Acton.

The win gave Acton a 2-1 series win over an underrated and gritty Rockwood squad, who finished the regular season with a lowly 5-13 record, but upset Kilbride in the semi-finals two-games-to-none and were one win away from a cinderella championship season. Acton pushed aside Campbellville in two-straight games in their semi-final series.

The two club's split the first two games of the series, an 18-4 whitewash win for Acton, Aug. 19 at Prospect

Park, and a 7-5 cliffhanger win for Rockwood at Lloyd Dyer Park in Rockwood, to set up the climactic final game.

In game three, Pitchers Brock Spear and Troy Ethier, as they have all season, came out firing beebees for the homeside. Spear struck out five Rockwood batters over the first three innings of the game to earn the win, with Ethier striking out seven more over the final three frames to pick up the save.

Offensively, it was a total team demolition for Acton with several players having good games at the plate. Greg Cole and Paul Vidic each had two rbi's for the winners, while Wes Kentner added an rbi and scored a run.

Also scoring for the champs were Spear and Peter Finnie with two runs each, and Ethier, Cole, Kyle Winters, Matt Dayman, Tyler Holmes.

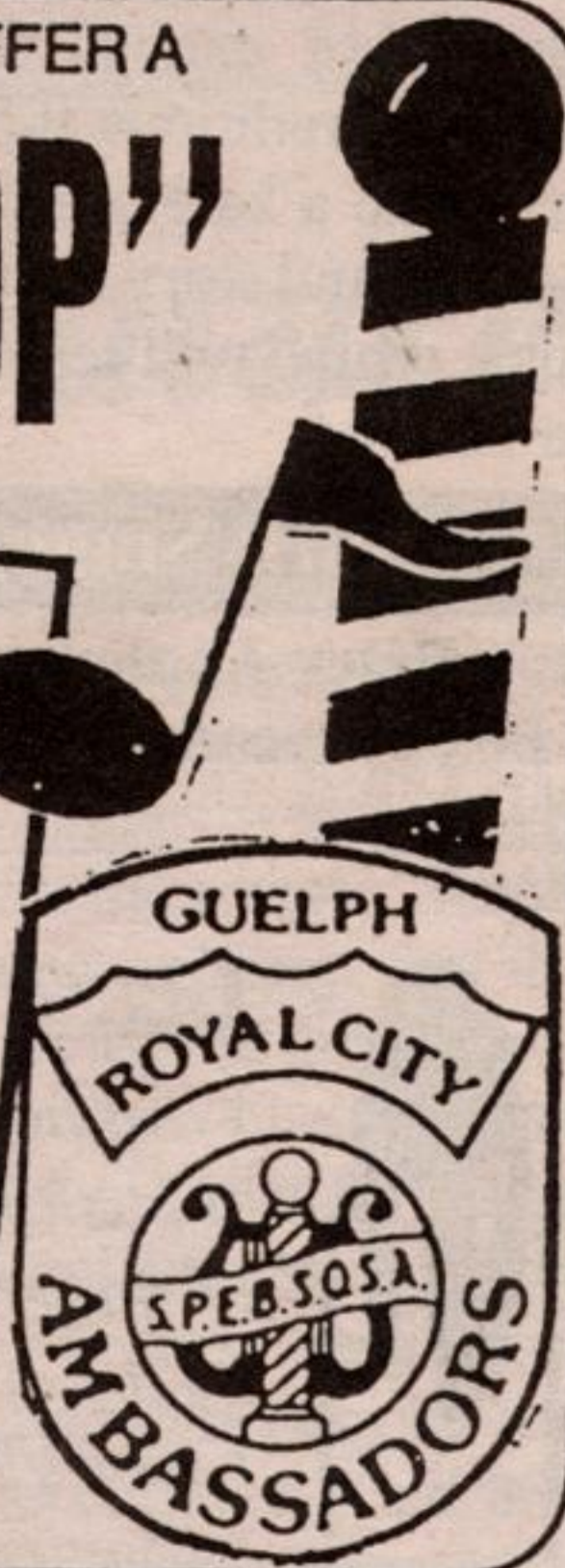

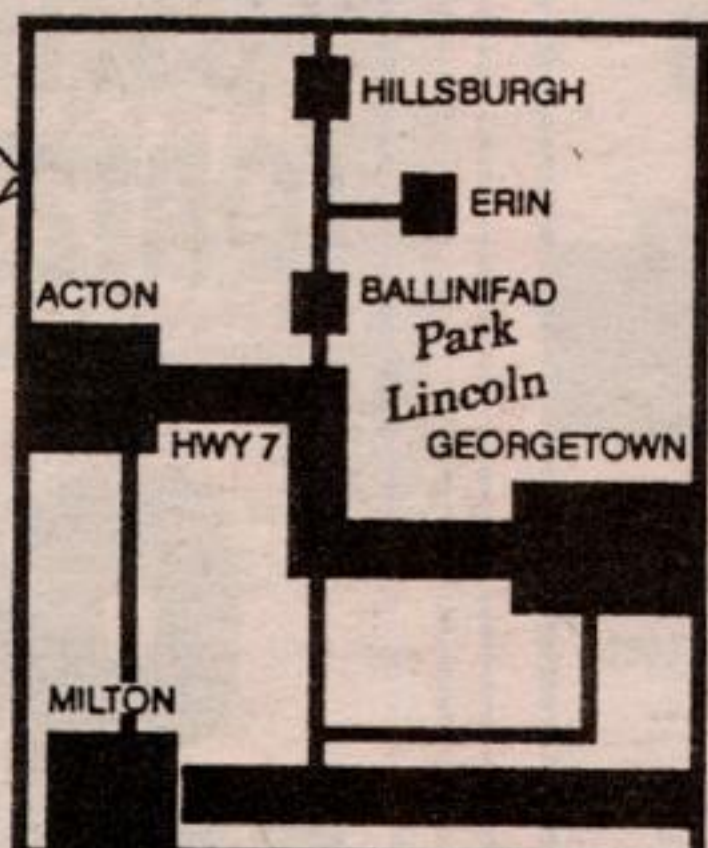
