

"No Stopping" means what it says


Main Street at School Lane has been a continual problem and a compaint area for many years. Drivers stop vehicles in areas clearly posted "NO STOPPING." Some are "just going to get a cup of coffee," others, "just making a short delivery," and probably the worst offenders, "just dropping my child off to go to school."

The Highway Act defines stopping as: stop or stopping when prohibited, means the halting of a vehicle, even momentarily, whether occupied or not, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or of a traffic control sign or signal.

Other reasons: stopping in areas posted as "No Stopping" is an offence under the Highway Traffic Act or the Halton Hills Bylaw and the driver may receive a Provincial Offences Notice ticket, with a fine of \$105, or a town bylaw ticket, with a fine of \$55.

Drivers should be aware that the "No Stopping" zone in the location of Main St. N. at School Lane has been extended in both directions.




