

Eco Logic attends REBA meeting

While we go about our daily routines of buying bread at Saunders and waving at Mr. Ingleson, the crossing guard, the people down the road at Eco Logic are using their technology to destroy hazardous stockpiles of chemical wastes that have been left untreated, in some cases, for decades.

Prior to meeting Martin Hassenbach, senior technical sales representative at Eco Logic and our guest speaker on Sept. 11, I, like many other Rockwood residents, had no idea what went on in "that yellow building on Dennis Street."

In fact, Eco Logic employs 125 people and has two waste processing plants (called "destructors"), one currently located in Australia and one in St. Catherines.

They have successfully demonstrated their process to

the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and are currently being considered by the U.S. Army to destroy chemical warfare agents. The process can be applied to hazardous wastes including PCBs, the treatment of contaminated soils and radioactive wastes.

A key aspect of Eco Logic's process is that it addresses safety and environmental concerns; for this reason it has received public assistance, including endorsements from such groups as Operation Clean Niagara and the Temagami Wilderness Society.

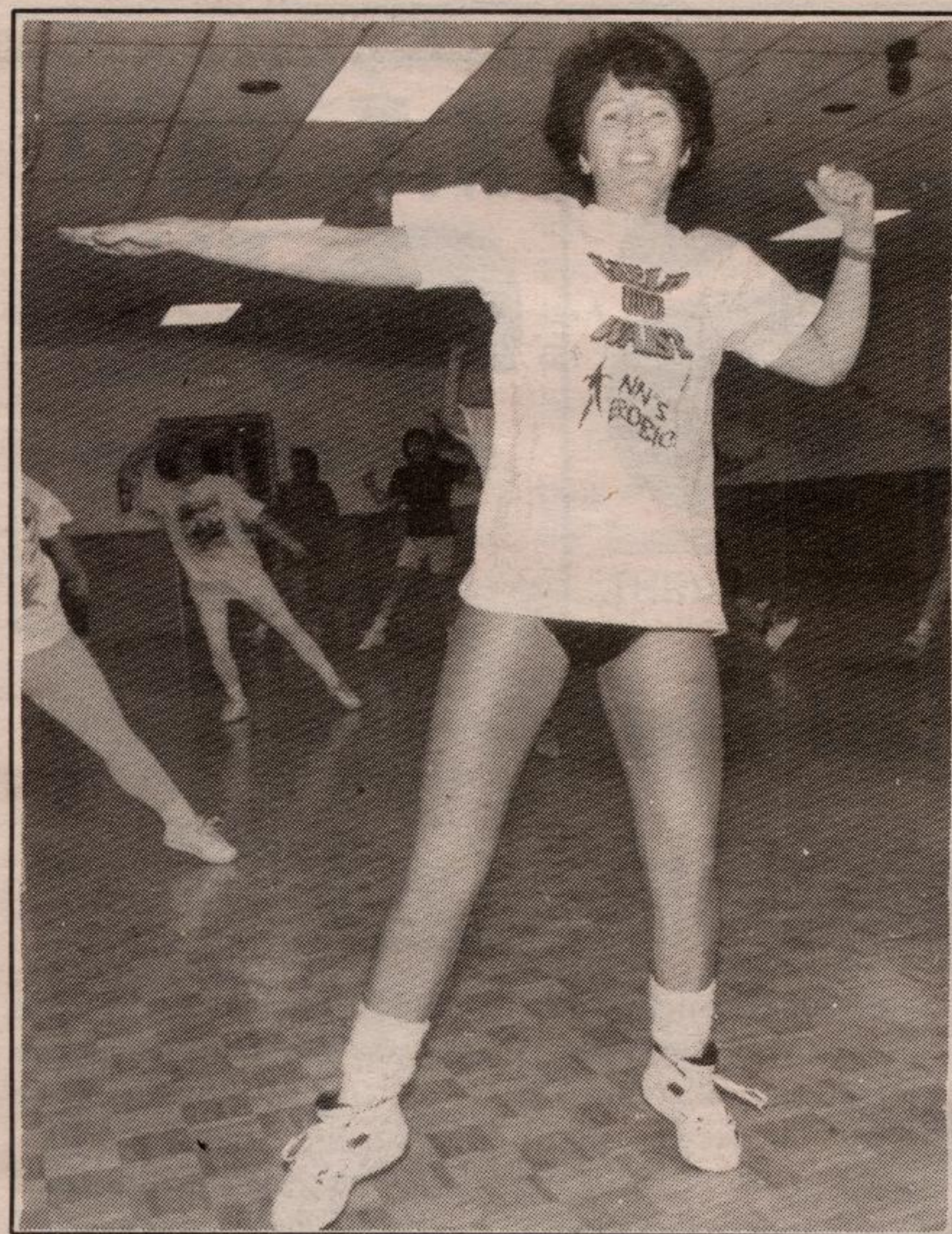
R.E.B.A. would like to replace the white banners on the hydro poles with Christmas theme banners.
