Trustee conflict hearing Nov. 14

Five Halton school board trustees, including Acton-Esquesing trustee Ethel Gardiner, will be in Milton court Nov. 14 to answer allegations that they breached conflict of interest legislation.

The complaint against the trustees, filed by a member of the Taxpayer Coalition Burlington Inc., alleges that because all five have rela-

tionship with Board employees, or employees of other Boards, they should have declared conflicts and not voted on the Board's \$272million budget last year.

Gardiner, on the advice of a lawyer, declared a conflict on the salary and compensation section of the budget and then voted on the whole budget at the end of the debate.
