## Off-duty cops at Chudleigh's

Chudleigh's, the popular apple farm on Hwy. 25, hired off-duty OPP officers to handle holiday weekend traffic after complaints from an Acton councillor about a bumper-to-bumper traffic jam two weekends ago.

Tom Chudleigh said that the Oct. 13 traffic jam, with cars backed up on Hwy. 25 all the way to Hwy. 401, came as a complete surprise.

"After a month of rain we had a bright sunny day and the red delicious apples were ready to be picked and we ended up with 1,100 cars and 7,500 people," Chudleigh explained on Sunday.

"The OPP did not feel that the traffic was hazardous so they didn't direct it, although they did give tickets to some people who parked illegally on the side of the highway," Chudleigh said, noting that after that weekend they phoned and asked to hire an off-duty officer for Sunday and Thanksgiving Monday, at a cost of between \$250 and \$400 per day.
