



Unsafe situation?

Town staff will be asked to investigate a complaint from a Rockwood woman who said the visual hazard at the corner of Hwy. 7 and River Drive causes very unsafe driving conditions for motorists.

Margie Parker saidher sister had an accident at the corner on Sept. 5 when she was trying to turn south onto Main Street from River Street.

"Due to vehicles parked at the corner she couldn't see properly to make a safe turn so she slowly crept out onto Hwy. 7 and was unable to avoid being hit," Parker wrote, asking that the Town's No Stopping area in the Robert Little School zone be extended southward to St. Alban's Drive.

Continued from Front Page both asking the Town to convey the building to them.

Ward 3 Councillor Moya Johnson said she could not support staff's recommendation to defer Heritage Acton's request and list the property until April 30, 1997.

Johnson pointed out what a good job Heritage Acton had done restoring the old Town Hall.

"We have to protect the heritage buildings we have left. I know the building has been appraised for an amount of money that would be helpful to our budget if we got it,

but we're trading off something that's really valuable here," Johnson said.

Ward 3 Councillor John Day suggested that the staff report be deferred until staff meet with Heritage Acton which he said had shown "an incredible amount of enthusiasm in this type of work."

Acton Councillor Rick Bonnette, said he was uncomfortable with the plan to list and sell the building, supported the deferral, noting that there's no parking in the area and that anyone buying the property would probably ask for high density zoning.
