years and recently received the go-ahead from the Coast Guard to submit plans for a replacement bridge, a two-lane structure that residents worry will forever change the character of their village. The Friends of Eden Mills also claim that rehabilitating the

"There's been some concern expressed by ratepayers in the village about bringing the issue to a final conclusion rather than see it going right down to the wire," Hughes explained recently.

Friends of Eden Mills spokesman Chris Wilson said the politicians continue to talk but so far there are no plans to comment on.

"They've submitted no plans, they've submitted no drawings, no cost estimates, there's nothing there - it's still talk," Wilson said, adding the offer to enhance a new bridge misses the point of the importance of a one-lane structure to Eden Mills.
