## Food drive numbers down from '95

Although the total amount of food donated in Saturday's sixth annual Scout-Guide Calvinist Cadet food drive was down substantially, organizers are grateful for what was donated.

A total of 10,780 pounds of food was donated in Limehouse and Acton, compared to 15,000 pounds last year - results that organizer Andrew Kayess said cause him "a little concern."

"I know the total seemed to be increasing over time but I suppose it has to come to a plateau some time," Kayess explained on Sunday.

"I don't know if it's the recession or maybe just the message didn't get out there. It's hard to pinpoint what the cause was."

Kayess said that he wanted to thank all the children, parents and volunteers who worked hard to collect and sort the donated food and also thanks to Tyler Transport, which donated a truck, and United Aggregates Limited, which let organizers use their weigh scales.

All of the food will be used to stock the shelves at Acton FoodShare, which depends on the annual drive. Kayess

said that Acton continues to be a very generous town.

"When you compare by volume what this little community provides, compared to Metropolitan Toronto, it's overly generous really.

"The total may be down this year but when you look at the whole picture it will go

a long way to helping feed the hungry," Kayess said.

FoodShare spokesperson Eileen Dix said that because of the tough times, they are very pleased with the results of Saturday's drive.

"The food donated should last us through the winter and we received a lot of the types

of food we need like canned fruit and vegetables, peanut butter and pasta," Dix said.

Anyone who was not canvassed on Saturday can drop off donations at FoodShare's Perth Street location Tuesdays from 9 am-2 pm or Saturdays from 10 am to noon, or call 853-0457 for pickup.

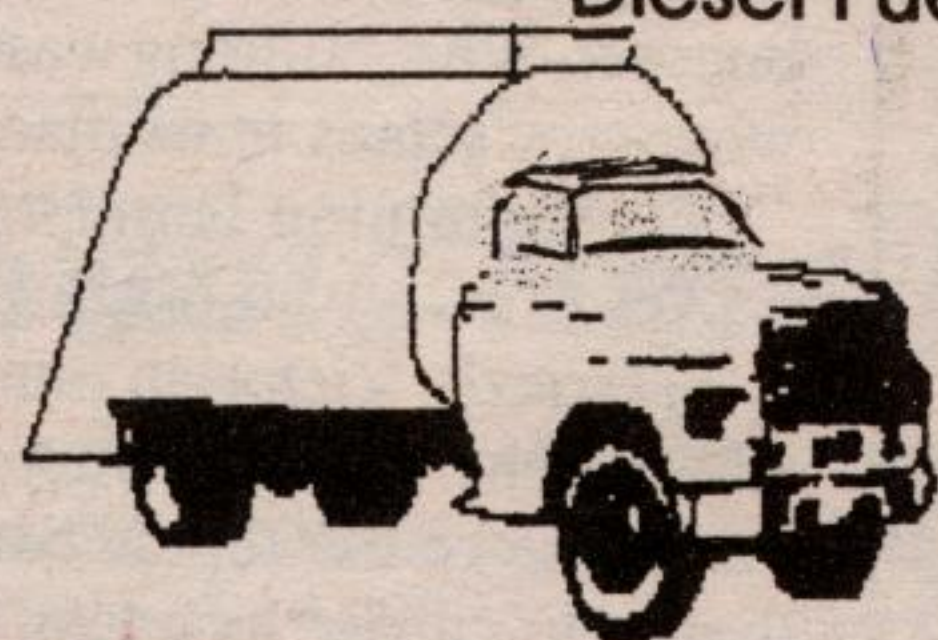

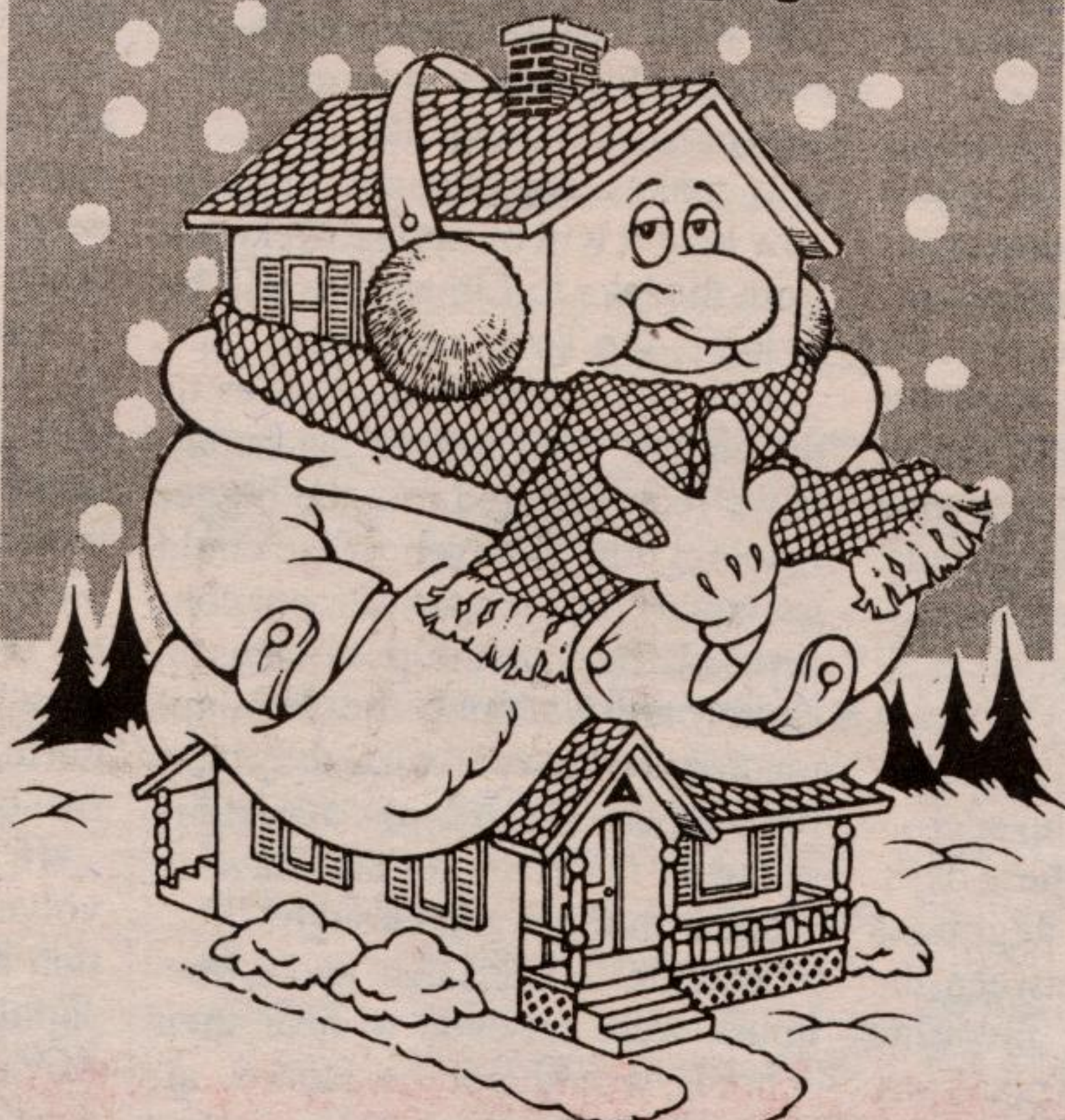
