# Eden Mills calms traffic

It looks as if Eden Mills will be getting a couple of stop signs to help calm traffic in the village.

Eramosa Township's roads advisory committee suggested one sign be installed at Barden and York Streets, across from the old mill. The second stop sign is proposed for the intersection of Wilson and York Streets.

Ministry of Transportation staff hope the stop signs will also help preserve the main bridge over the Eramosa River, which is in bad shape:

There's concern that as vehicles turn, they are driving over a poured sidewalk. MTO said the stop sign would change the actual angle of cars going over the bridge to avoid the sidewalk.

### Lights on!

Some Rockwood area farmers are already planning how to decorate their combines and farm equipment for the village's annual Parade of Lights, scheduled for Dec. 19.

Organizer Murray Williamson said they were pleased to learn they were covered under the Township's liability insurance and with Council's offer to file the necessary special occasion permit for the popular event, which included 19 farm floats last year.


