

Doula provides labour support

The scary hospital birth of Laurel Sparrow's first child led the Rockwood resident and self-described "midwife wannabe" to train to become a doula - a birth coach who provides non-medical support to pregnant women and new mothers.

The midwife-assisted home birth of Sparrow's second child convinced her that she wanted to help other women be in control of their deliveries. She began training as a doula, working on a certification program with the Doulas of North America.

Doulas - Greek for wise woman or servant - are nonmedical professionals who are trained to provide emotional support, physical comfort, instruction and friendship to women giving birth.

Sparrow, a freelance book editor who plans to study to be a midwife when her children are older, said birth fascinates her and being a doula allows her a great privilege.

"Births are so exciting. Seeing a dog have puppies is exciting for me," Sparrow laughed. "It's even more exciting to see a little person come into the world - it's a tremendous rush."

Sparrow has attended at 10 births, including that of her former Etobicoke neighbour Gabriella Pattulo.

"Ihadn't considered a midwife for my first baby because it was going to be in the hospital but I wanted Laurel with me because she had such a good attitude about birth," Patullo explained on Friday.

"I was so impressed with the help and care that I got from Laurel that I recommended her to my sister for her baby's birth."

Although several hospitals, including Oakville Trafalgar, have doulas on-call, Sparrow said there is some resistance to doulas, mainly by nurses facing cutbacks.

"They think that you're taking over their job, or that you're taking the nice part of their job which they would like to have time to do, but often they don't," she said.

Sparrow said she attempts to keep her clients comfortable and in control of their birth experience.

"I don't think that a woman ever forgets the births of her children, and so you want the memories to be good ones. The doula is here to help protect that memory for you."

Hiring a doula can cost from \$300 to \$600 and while not covered by OHIP, may be covered by some health insurance plans. For more details call Sparrow, 856-1176.
