International hockey coming to Acton

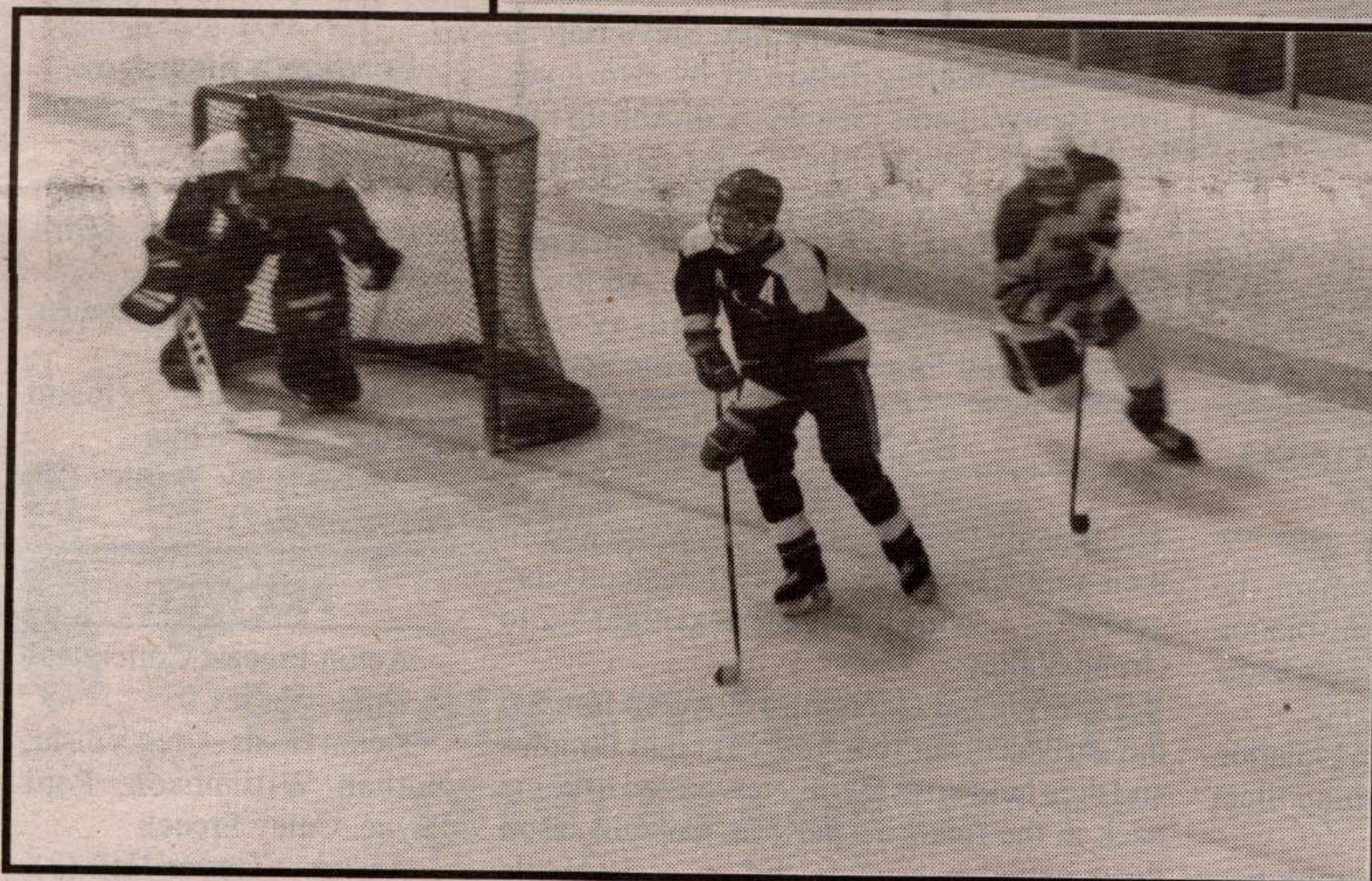
The Acton High School hockey club is getting ready to take on a Midget Rep team from Dallas, Texas, on Dec. 5 at 7:50 pm.

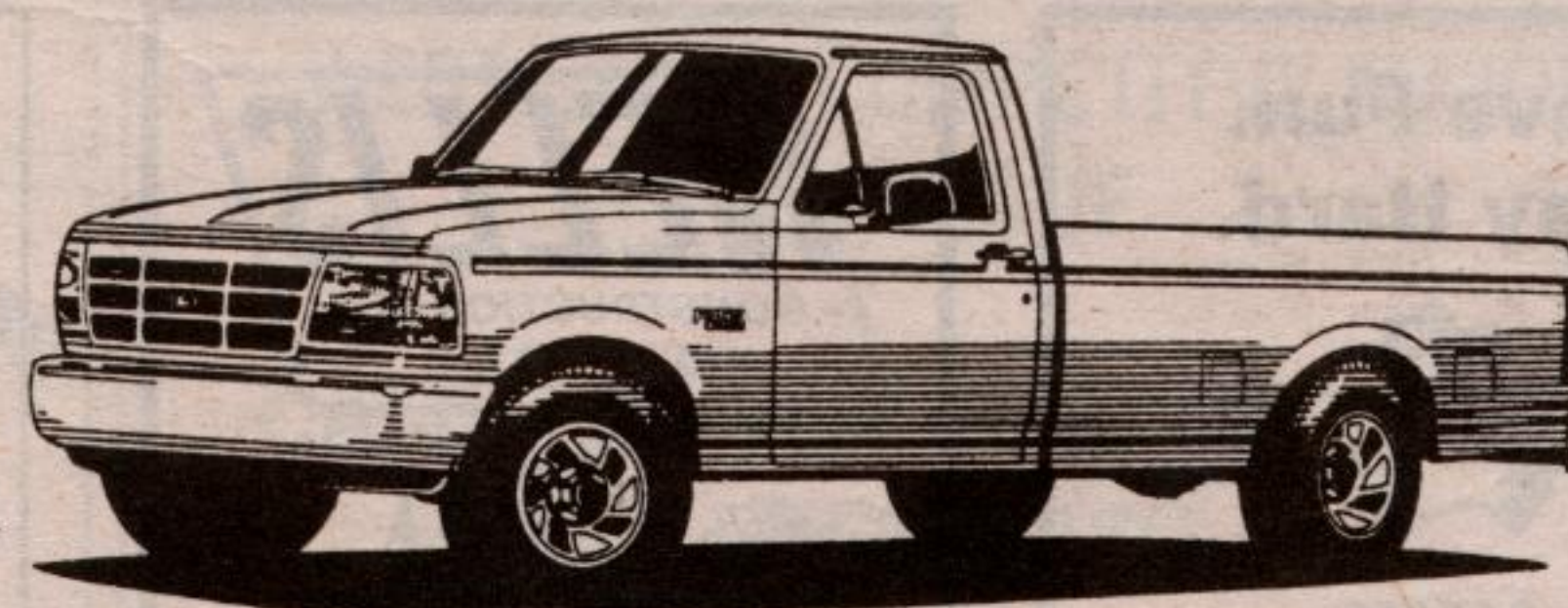
Acton hopes to continue their good play against some of the top teams in the league.
