

Board investigates headquarters sale

Although Esquesing school board trustee Ethel Gardiner is pleased that the Board of Education agreed to look at selling its Burlington head-quarters, she's not impressed that the report on the proposal won't come back until June – long after the Board has dealt with its restructuring plans, which include proposals to close and sell off 11 properties.

The initial motion to look at selling the J.W. Singleton Education Centre asked for a staff report within weeks, but trustees amended that time frame until the end of June.

During debate at the last

Board meeting, trustee Gardiner argued that if the goal of the Board's renewal plan was to look at everything from the ground up, then the Singleton Centre should be included in the Board's accommodation study.

"Moving administrative staff to area centres would certainly put education services closer to the community, particularly in the north where at the present time, parents tend to feel somewhat isolated in terms of the whole process of education and in terms of where to go when addressing concerns beyond the school level," Gardiner said.

Gardiner said they might gain more financially by closing the Singleton Centre – as much as \$3 or \$4 million – than by closing five schools located in areas where they have little real estate value.

"If we're willing to close schools and move children while still providing quality education, we should be willing to investigate the possibility of closing Singleton and moving adults while still providing quality service," Gardiner said.


