Watch for deer: police

The OPP are reminding motorists of the increase in motor vehicle collisions involving deer. The winter weather brings an increase in activity of deer.

At dusk and dawn movement increases, and special care should be taken when traveling on roadways with any tree cover. If a deer is observed in your path while traveling on the highway, slow down and drive defensively. Deer usually travel in pairs or more, so if one is observed, slow down and be prepared for more.

If your vehicle is involved in an accident, you are required by law to report it to

police if any of these conditions apply:

- apparent damage is more than \$700
- any personal injury
- any property damage.

the quarry so the aggregate can be mined, might adversely affect the quality and quantity of their well water.

In response to concerns about speeding trucks ignoring after-hour bans, Spear said UAL is working with the police to patrol the Fourth Line prior to 6 am and Maple Avenue after noon on Saturdays. If they find trucks us-

ing the roads illegally, they have their own disciplinary action that can be taken, which could include banning the violating truck for a week or two.

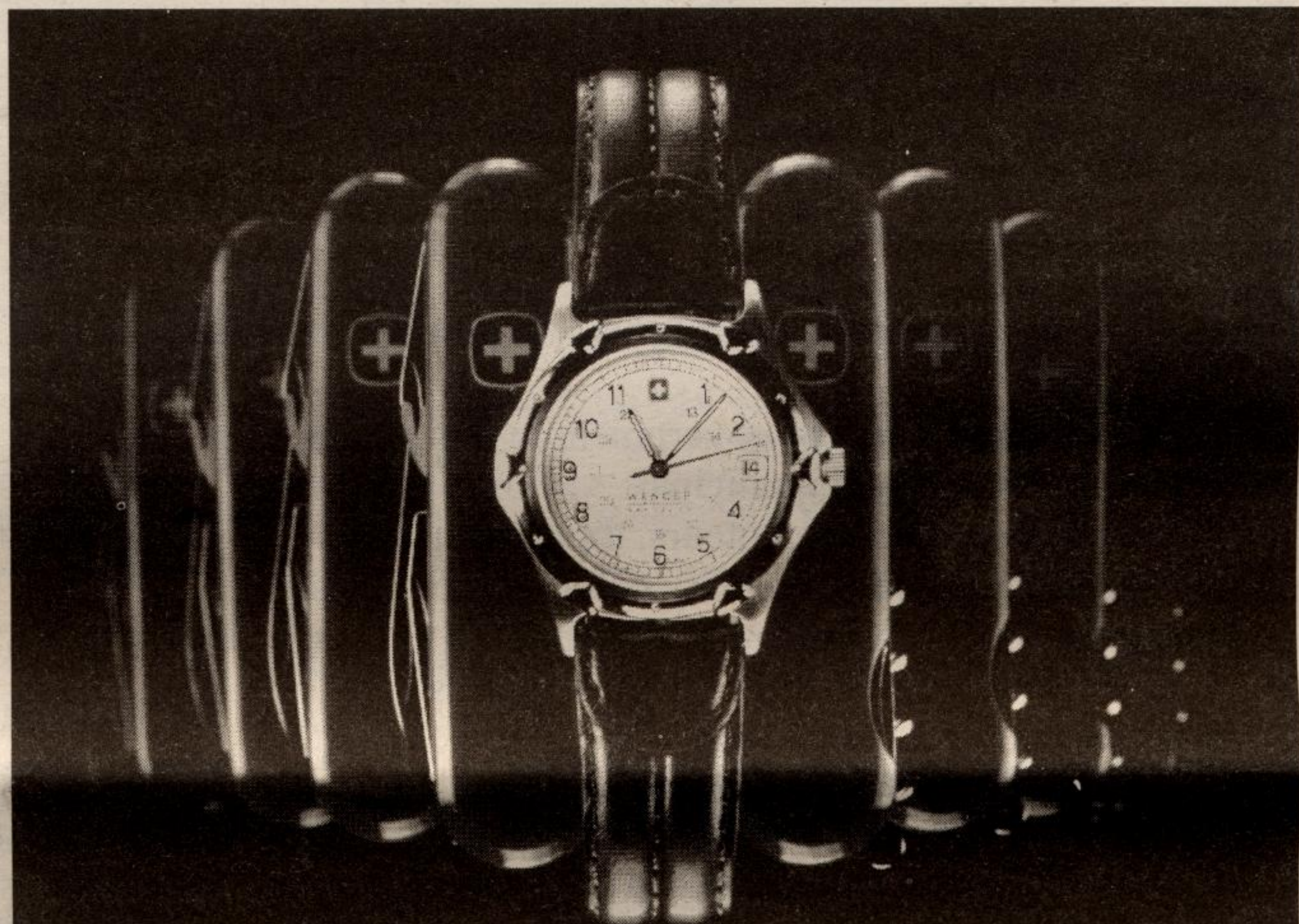
UAL is also planning school tours of the quarry and Spears issued an invitation to councillors to visit as well.

Quarry neighbour Pat Woode, who is also a member of a quarry liaison com-

mittee set up by the province, said her first reaction to UAL's public relations campaign is "wait and see."

"Words are very shallow if they are never followed by action," Woode said in an interview on Saturday.

"We've really seen very little action on UAL's part. They will have to prove that they plan to make amendments - I'd love to see some cooperation."
