A motion to send them \$50 was made by Mary McKenzie and seconded by Betty Oakes.



Our Regent showed us the new plaque to be placed on the service groups sign on


the outskirts of town, replacing the previous plaque, broken by vandals. Ernestine will take the new plaque home to have a frame made, to help strengthen it.
