Monica Gordon, a Grade 7 student at Rockwood Centennial School, has taken the first steps to becoming an internationally recognized artist by winning a local competition sponsored by the Rockwood and District Lions Club. She was also picked by District A15 to have her poster sent to the Multiple District.

Gordon's poster is among thousands of entries submitted world-wide in the 9th Annual Lions International Peace Poster Contest. Of all the entries from Rockwood Centennial school, Gordon's entry best portrayed the contest's theme, "Building a


Peaceful World."

Rockwood Lions Club President Doug Robb said he was pleased with all the work the students at the school put into the project.

Lions Club International is sponsoring the contest to emphasize the importance of world peace to young people everywhere.

Ultimately, one grand prize winner will be selected from 24 finalists. The grand prize includes a cash reward of \$1,500 (U.S.), plus an allexpense paid trip for the winner and two family members to New York for the awards ceremony at the United Nations, in March 1997. The remaining 23 finalists will receive a certificate and a cash award of \$250 (U.S.).

"We know Monica has a long way to go, and we wish her luck," Robb said.

Dottie's turns one


Dottie's Diner, which has become a new Rockwood tradition, celebrates its first anniversary this Boxing Day.
