Plans are now being developed to turn this entire property into an attractive expanse of greenery with shrubs, small trees and seasonal plantings. A blue spruce will provide year round appeal and next year at this time, Acton will hopefully have its own decorated town Christmas tree! The project has been funded entirely by the Acton BIA and their Board of Managers will oversee the construction, slated to begin in the Spring of 1997.

The floral display in downtown Acton this past summer was just gorgeous and thanks should go not just to the BIA but to the Acton Horticultural Society as well. The Acton plant brackets were commissioned and funded by the BIA, the plants were purchased by the BIA and their employee Karen Honeywell, was responsible for keeping the flower baskets watered and maintained throughout the summer. Karen also maintained the curb planters and kept our downtown streets swept clean of debris. The Horticultural Society looked after the selection and planting of all the curb planters. 
ance in putting up and taking down the hanging planters.


