



Variety of charges laid

A 19-year-old Brampton resident faces a variety of charges in connection with a series of incidents dating back to last August.

Police executed an arrest warrant on the man following the report of an assault on the man's former common-law companion, an 18-year-old Main Street South woman on Dec. 22 at 7:30 pm.

Police report that the male entered the residence with the intention of taking a stereo system belonging to the woman. A struggle ensued in which it is alleged that the male pushed the female to the ground and then removed the stereo receiver.

Police report that on the evening of Jan. 4 the man became involved in an altercation with his brother in which the brother was threatened with death.

Further investigation revealed that the suspect was being sought by police in connection with an assault on a Churchill Road youth in which a 14year-old male was grabbed by the throat and pushed to the ground on Aug. 22.

Police report the Brampton man faces two counts of assault, break and enter, theft, and uttering death threats. He was held for bail.
