Adult lifestyle discussions


Township Council and staff will meet with their planning consultants on Jan. 27 to discuss the pros and cons of adult lifestyle communities.

Eramosa Exit looking for extras

The scary prospect of a super highway slicing through the centre of rural Eramosa is the subject of a one-hour docudrama now being filmed in the Township.

With the funding of a local "patron" and technical support from Rogers Cable TV, Rockwood film maker Mark Hamilton wrote the script and is now directing it, using volunteer crew and actors. The filming began in late summer and will culminate with the staging of a mock Ontario Municipal Board hear-

ing to be filmed at the Rockwood Town Hall on Feb. 1 and 2. Hamilton is looking for extras to be part of the audience at the hearing.

"I need between 30 and 40 extras who will be available both days to play the parts of interested residents who come to the hearing to find out if the proposal for this fictitious super highway will be approved," Hamilton explained Friday. "There are some speaking parts, but mainly I need people who are willing to sit and react to what

is happening at this hearing."

Hamilton, a Rockwood native whose family settled in the village in 1832, produces television documentaries and educational videos and worked on a number of projects at TVO, one of the broadcast outlets where he will attempt to get the finished *Eramosa Exit* aired.

Hamilton said the script doesn't make a political statement, but rather a social one.

"The film takes the tone that you just can't sort of shut out the rest of the world to preserve the rural lifestyle in this area," Hamilton explained. "It's about the fact that the rural history is something that is more than most people realize. It's more than a way of life – it's a distinct culture that you don't recognize unless you're from a small town."

Filming and editing should be completed by the spring and there will be a local showing of the finished product.
