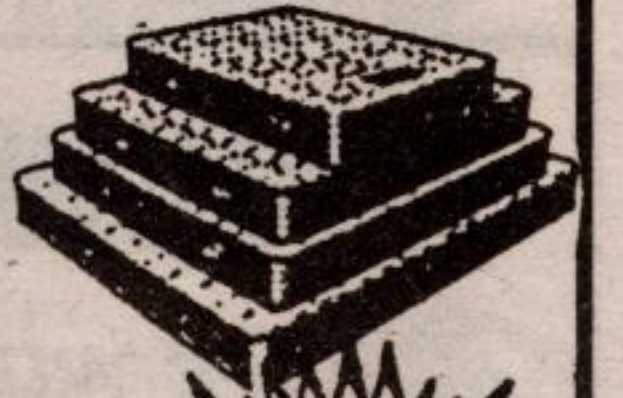

The uniform recruitment and development unit of the Ontario Provincial Police is launching a campaign to attract persons to serve as police officers.

Staff Sergeant Wendy Wilson, says due to attrition, largely through the retirement of officers hired in the mid-to-late 1960s, the OPP will hire approximately 225 people this year and repeat the process in 1998.

Wilson says the OPP is committed to fair employment practices, which ensure that qualified men and women have access to employment and that hiring decisions are made on the basis of merit.

Canadian citizens or permanent residents 18 years and over, who are medically, mentally and physically fit for police duties, are invited to apply, if they meet the following minimum qualifications.

An applicant must be of good moral character with no criminal record, be a secondary school graduate, be fluent in speaking and writing English, meet vision requirements and be willing to serve anywhere in Ontario.
